Her work researches the notion of informality, focusing on informal economies and non-conformist communal structures, their principles influencing the aesthetics of her videos. Medvedeva's

works have been exhibited at Stedelijk Museum Amsterdam; Sonic Acts Festival, Amsterdam; WIELS Contemporary Art Centre, Brussels; Al-Ma'mal Foundation for Contemporary Art, Jerusalem; Inversia Festival, Murmansk; Rotterdam City Theatre; Art Brussels; Centre of Fine Arts Groningen; De Nieuwe Vide gallery, Haarlem and screened during IDFA Docs for Sale and on VPRO among others. SELECTION OF WORKS BY POLINA MEDVEDEVA

01 THE INFORMALS/HEФOPMAЛЫ, 2019, 33' SONIC ACTS FESTIVAL '19, OORTREDENS '20, LIGHTHOUSE BRIGHTON, LOFOTEN INTERNATIONAL ART FESTIVAL '19, A4 BRATISLAVA SUPPRTED BY STIMULERINGSFONDS CREATIEVE INDUSTRIE AND SONIC ACTS

The Informals/Неформалы is partly an autobiographical work, as well as a universal statement on the notions of decentralization, collectivism and non-conformist ways of living among the youth in the digital age. The audiovisual collaboration between Polina Medvedeva and Andreas Kühne researches the improvisation technique in the medium documentary and in its methodology resembles the patterns of the digital natives of Murmansk, who in order to escape the norms and social constructs of the Northern Region of Russia navigate to deserted spaces in their area, and through their collective presence improvise with the space, adding a new layer to its genealogy. Medvedeva and Kuhne travel back to the former military zone Medvedeva was born in and through documentation and field improvisation, much like the youths of Murmansk region, by resonating with this now abandoned area temporarily transfer it into the present. The collected data, divided into separate interchangeable contextual elements and prepared for live triggering and processing, resembles an audiovisual instrument which, when played by the artist duo, produces and exports new unscripted versions with each live performance, with narrations, connections and interpretations emerging through the presence of the audience.





02 THE CHAMPAGNE DRINKERS: RUSSIA'S INFORMAL ECONOMY FROM THE BACKSEAT OF A TAXI, 2015-18, 53' STEDELIJK MUSEUM AMSTERDAM, 2DOC, AL-MA'MAL FOUNDATION FOR CONTEMPORARY ART

Drawing on my childhood memories of growing up in Russia during the transition to capitalism in the 1990s, I analyze the informal economies that provide a livelihood for a significant portion of the population. The video installation The Champagne Drinkers focuses on the unlicensed taxi drivers in my hometown of Pskov, who proudly defend their work by citing a Russian proverb: "One who doesn't take risks doesn't drink champagne." Recording from the back seat, I document a population of resourceful, strong-willed individuals who refuse to give in to hopelessness, even when faced with widespread unemployment and financial hardship. For a 2018 exhibition at the Stedelijk Museum, the film has been set up as an installation, and is accompanied by smartphones placed between car seats reflecting on the film three years later, where feverish economic activity of this newly-formed precariat is contrasted by continuous waiting for the order.


03 ALIEN, 2019, VIDEO, 7', STILL FROM VIDEO DECONSTRUCTING FIELD STUDIES WORKSHOP

Narva is a former industrial city in Eastern Estonia, only separated from Russia by the Narva river. The (pedestrian) border crossing looks like an unremarkable bridge connecting two sides of a city. This is, however, one of the most strategic and well guarded bor-ders in the world, separating not only the two countries but also European Union and NATO states from Eurasian Economic Union and CSTO, and East from the West. The video was developed during an interdisciplinary workshop I was leading at the Narva Art Residency and follows Jaroslavna, a young women from Narva visiting her grandmother over the bridge in Ivangorod. Born in Nar-va just before the fall of the Soviet Union Jaroslavna, as part of the Ethnic Russian population in Estonia didn't receive an Estonian citizenship, nor a Russian one, but carries a grey passport called 'Alien', often issued in Estonia at the beginning of the 90s. This enables her to travel freely within EU and also in Russia but prevents her from occupying state positions and voting in Estonia's general elections. In this work the notions of identity and non-belonging are addressed implicitely through a family gathering.

#VerlorenJongesZullenWinnen (#Gamechangers) is a transmedia documentary researching the new media as a tool of implicit resistance in the hands of the new generation of Dutch youths. For us as independent makers operating outside of the traditional margins of disciplines, this project is an experiment on new forms of storytelling, with which we search for the borders of the medium documentary in the context of new media. The work is a film, an installation and a live event where the audience is immersed in a mix of the online world and live performances – from dance, film and theatre to spoken word and dialogue. The film follows young people who, armed with a phone, a camera or a microphone challenge existing power structures and mainstream imaging. In three parts we follow these gamechangers, together with a group of high school youths of Rotterdam-Zuid and two young artists who try to find success on stage without losing themselves in between two cultures. Next to the event, the installation shows the three parts of the work, which continue into an up-to-date playlist displaying the social media channels of the work, which continue into an up-to-date gram lives.

In this turbulent time for the UK we aim to portray this active generation of young talented thinkers, many of whom are not seen in this way by the institutions and authorities due to their socio-economic position on the fringes of the society or their (educational) background. In times when the political decisions taken are not representative of these youths, they use their (musical) culture to reclaim public spaces and to spread their progressive views challenging stigmas and stereotypes. With this audiovisual performance we strive to document their emancipatory practices which, no matter how subtle or implicit, sketch an inclusive and collective portrait of the generation of digital natives and provide a more accurate representation of Brighton.

06 AREA C, SYSTEM D: DEALINGS ALONG THE JERUSALEM-RAMALLAH ROAD 2017, 84' WIELS CONTEMPORARY ART CENTRE BRUSSELS, ART BRISSELS, AL-MA'MAL FOUNDATION FOR CONTEMPORARY ART, JERUSALEM-SUPPORTED BY STIMULERINGSFONDS CREATIEVE INDUSTRIE

Area C, System D was filmed over the course of a year in Al-Ram and Kufr Aqab, and at the Qalandia, al-Am'ari and Kaddoura refugee camps in the West Bank. The documentary depicts the informal socio-political structures of these locations, which remain ungovernable by both Palestinian and Israeli authorities. Area C, System D portrays the thriving grey economy and self-governance along the main Jerusalem-Ramallah road, where shops and buildings are unlicensed, the cars often stolen and where the electricity and sewer lines are built on one's own initiative. Told from the perspectives of shopkeepers and a group of young musicians heading for their illegal concert in an unlicensed car, the film is a parallel narration of both daily struggle and resilience, desperation and the power of individuals, amid a constant bustle of vibrant entreprise and rap.
